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Nurses Attitudes Towards Continuing Formal

The education of nurses has an influence on patient safety and outcomes, the nursing shortage, the faculty shortage, and nurses' attitudes and actions. This article reports on a dissertation study designed to examine the attitudes of nurses, initially registered with an associate degree or diploma in nursing, toward continuing formal education. The main finding of this study was that, although nurses held positive attitudes overall, attitudes ranked barely above neutral. The findings suggest that work needs to be done to improve nurses' attitudes toward continuing formal education and research needs to be undertaken to understand what would entice nurses back to school.

In a nationwide survey of more than 600 nurses across various settings and age groups, many participants commented that nursing's emphasis on lifelong learning, continuing education, and returning to school are things that nurses do well. 9 However, nurses face certain challenges regarding their ongoing education and professional development.

Continuing Professional Education in Nursing

Aims: This article is a report of a study to determine the effect of an educational programme and to follow up weekly meetings on nurses and medical resident's attitudes towards positive communication and collaboration. Background: Clear and appropriate communication and interdisciplinary collaboration is critical to the delivery of quality care.

The Effect of an Educational Programme on Attitudes of ...

Nurses, like other hospital personnel have always shown concern about the effect of such systems. With enough training and awareness the healthcare professionals will be able to use EMR efficiently [10,12]. Moreover, a substantial evidence supports that success of EMR implementation is related to the attitude of nurse towards the system [1,4,11].

Pre-tests and post-tests were done. RESULTS: The results of this study showed that OR nurses' attitudes towards a culture of patient safety was originally negative; significant improvement after attending the programme was found (3.3 ± 0.20 versus 3.8 ± 0.30).

While a large percentage of the nurses in this study had favorable attitudes toward mandatory continuing education, many of them qualified their attitudes by stating that mandatory continuing ...

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
